Third Sunday of Advent

So, What Should We Do?

Today's Gospel comes across with a refreshing and practical simplicity. "What should we do?" is the question everyone keeps asking the Baptizer in today's Gospel. It's not only a good question, it's the right question! They didn't ask, "What should we say?" or "What should we read?" or "What should we think?" or "What should we feel?" It's not that what you say and think is irrelevant; it's just incomplete and stagnant. Instead they asked about what actions they should take in response to the preaching of God's Messenger. John doesn't hold back or mince words: "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do the likewise". To the tax collectors he says: "Stop cheating and robbing your customers!" To the soldiers he says: "Stop extorting the people and making false accusations against them". To all of us he says: Treat your neighbor the way you would want to be treated and treat God the way God deserves to be treated! In other words, turn away from sin and start practicing your faith!

Catholic teaching, rooted in the Scriptures, offers us some very specific and concrete ways of putting our faith into action: Namely, practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. These works of mercy highlight 14 acts of charity and justice. The seven Corporal Works of Mercy are actions directly related to the care of and concern for the physical (body) and material needs of our neighbors. They are: Feed the hungry; Give drink to the thirsty; Clothe the naked; Shelter the homeless; Visit the sick; Visit the imprisoned; and Bury the dead. The seven Spiritual Works of Mercy are equally concrete but directed towards the needs of the soul (i.e., the heart and mind). They are: Admonish (warn, caution, correct) the sinner; Instruct the ignorant (especially regarding the tenets of the Faith); Counsel the doubtful; Comfort the sorrowful; Bear wrongs patiently; Forgive all injuries; and Pray for the living and the dead.


The Seven Principles of *Catholic Social Teaching* further highlight our call and obligation to DO the work of justice. These principles include the innate dignity of the human person, rights and responsibilities (e.g., to food, shelter, healthcare, employment, etc.), preferential option for the poor, the dignity of work and the right to unionize and the obligation to be good stewards of the earth and good stewards of each other (solidarity).

When you ask the right question and get the right answer, there is only one thing left that matters: DOING the right thing.


